The Carson Local Energy Project

The Carson Local Energy Project is an effort by California Resources Corporation, in partnership with local Carson businesses, residents and stakeholders to boost the local economy while increasing domestic energy supplies.

The energy project, located in the industrial Dominguez Technology Centre, is currently undergoing a comprehensive environmental review. This review is managed by the City and an independent panel of experts to ensure that the project meets the highest environmental standards, and safeguards neighboring communities.

Through the safe production of energy, the Carson Local Energy Project will create hundreds of new jobs and:

- Millions of dollars in revenue will be generated every year for Carson and regional governments. This revenue will fund vital services like police and fire protection, neighborhood public schools, and local infrastructure.
- The project also includes a binding project labor agreement with the Los Angeles County Building & Construction Trades Council. This agreement ensures workers will be highly trained and well paid.
- The agreement also requires that Carson residents are given priority on hiring for new jobs in the project.

About California Resources Corporation



California Resources Corporation (CRC) operates the California oil and natural gas assets of Occidental Petroleum Corporation, including the proposed Carson Local Energy Project. Following its planned separation from Occidental,

CRC will be an independent, publicly-traded company that is the largest combined oil and natural gas producer in California. CRC's workforce of 8,000 employees and contractors will focus exclusively on oil and natural gas exploration and production in California in a safe and responsible manner.

Highest Standards

Independent Environmental Oversight and Community Input

Prior to approval, the Carson Local Energy Project must pass extensive independent environmental review. As part of the independent environmental review, Carson residents have provided input to the City to make sure their concerns are addressed before the project is approved. Hydraulic fracturing, also known as fracking, will not be used in the project.

The Carson Local Energy Project will be closely monitored by government regulators. State-of-the-art, 24-hour computerized monitoring and control systems are used to oversee operations and highly-trained technical staff are required to be on-site at all times.

- Monitors will ensure compliance with all environmental standards.
- The drilling rig and the facility will be powered by electricity only, which will reduce noise levels and protect air quality.
- The project will not use hydraulic fracturing, also known as fracking.



Safety First

Advanced Technology Safeguarding the Environment

The Carson Local Energy Project's technology and operating procedures meet California's highest environmental standards. The use of state-of-the-art technologies as well as oversight by multiple independent agencies and site monitors will ensure the highest level of safety and environmental protection for Carson's neighborhoods.

The City's Draft Environmental Impact Report concluded that the project's operation will not have a significant impact on air, soil, or water quality. This is reflective of the cutting-edge technologies, advanced design features and mitigation measures proposed.

- State-of-the-art technology is safe, quiet and environmentally friendly.
- Drinking water will not be impacted. All water quality standards will be satisfied.
- Soundproofed walls and creative design will keep the site quiet and make the project look just like the surrounding warehouses.

Regular monitoring and reporting to the community will occur to ensure the project meets its high environmental standards, as well as laws and regulations governing public health, safety and the environment.
